Citizen Science




Get an identification! Help keep track of biodiversity! Download the iNaturalist app or go to inaturalist.org to upload pictures of plants and animals. If found at the Pinnacles, Owsley Fork Reservoir, Brushy Fork, or Anglin Falls, your observations will automatically be added to the project "Biodiversity of the Berea College Forest." There, you can add to the growing list of 1,338 species that have been observed so far!
