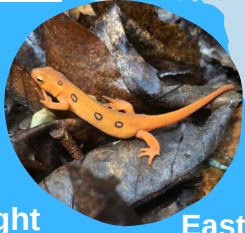
Salamander

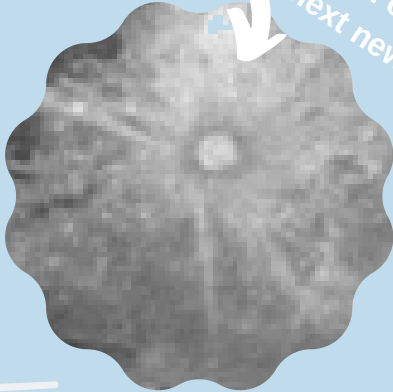


Adult Male
