

Brushy Fork Trail Update!

Recently the Berea College
Foresters, along with labor
student Tsu Isaka, installed new
trail markers throughout the
Brushy Fork and Cross-Country
trail system. New markers have
been installed and each trail is
color-coded to assist hikers in
navigation. These trails are
located adjacent to college's
main campus, directly behind
the Alumni Building and Alumni
Fields.





Berea College Forest: Did You Know?



The 203 acres where the Brushy Fork and Cross-Country trail system is located is the oldest tract of the Berea College Forest! It was purchased by Forester Silas Mason (featured in our last newsletter, check it out!) from former Berea College President E.P. Fairchild and his wife Lillian in January of 1903.



President Edward Henry Fairchild, born in Stockbridge, Massachusetts moved with his family to Northeast Ohio. Fairchild studied theology at Oberlin College, and as a member of the anti-slavery movement was offered the position of president at Berea College (1869-1889). The Pinnacles, Brushy
Fork, and Anglin Falls
trails are OPEN. The
Forestry Outreach Center
and restrooms are
CLOSED.
