# The Power of Pollinators National Pollinator Week: June 19th-25th

Pollinators are the behind-the-scenes workers that sustain our food sources and keep beautiful flowers blooming. Without them, life as we know it would not exist. From bees to bats, pollinators make the world go 'round and we like to celebrate them every day!

The milkweed in our garden has helped feed and shelter multiple monarch caterpillars this spring!

#### What you can do...

If you care for a yard, garden, forest, etc. there are steps you can take to promote the growth of pollinator-friendly plants. Choose native instead of cultivated--there are gorgeous native flowers that are built for this ecosystem. Avoid pesticides, and keep the plants from being overcrowded (you can try transplanting and giving some to friends!). You can learn and get involved with Tiny Forest, a volunteer-led group interested in shifting from lawns to native



plants. If interested, contact us!

You can visit a new native plant pollinator garden on Berea City property located at the end of Silver Creek Drive off Prospect Street (on the south side of the Berea Utilities Building). This spring, volunteers cleared a

small site along Brushy Fork Creek of invasive non-native species and planted native, pollinator-friendly plants. Everyone is welcome to visit the garden at any time. Eventually, the vision is for more volunteers to create a series of native pollinator gardens along the Berea walking/biking paths.
